Welcome to our new ward newsletter! We hope to bring you updates on our ward priorities and news on recent crime, antisocial behaviour and positive action taken. It's written by your local Neighbourhood Team based at Guisborough, so please let us know if you have any feedback.

As some residents will know, youth related anti social behaviour, including drug taking and the consumption of alcohol continues to be something we are addressing with extra patrols in the Wildlife Pond area.

This seems to be a small minority of young people creating problems. We are in the process of identifying those involved, and we will be conducting home address visits.

You said, we did

We received complaints in relation to harassment and threats in the Kirkstall Court area. A restraining order has been obtained and arrests made on suspicion of breaches.

We carried out increased patrols in the area and will continue to do so.

Property Marking

Don't forget that the many thefts occur through vehicles, garages, sheds and houses being left insecure. Please lock up your property and keep valuables out of sight.

Also remember to take basion precautions to ensure you house does not appeal empty on dark nights.

We can mark your property and register it online to protect it and aid its recovery in the unfortunate event that it is stolen.

Crime, ASB figures and Priorities

Through out the month of January 2021

- We have had 3 reported incidents of criminal damage.
- 5 reported incidents of shop theft, and other theft
- 2 reported incidents of burglaries, both were residential burglaries
- 13 reported incidents in anti-social behaviour incidents, some of these are Covid breaches.
- There were less recorded crimes in Skelton East in January 2021 than any other month in over a year.

Having discussed our current issues across the ward with local councillors and considering the calls we receive, the ward priorities are:

- Tackling youth related ASB/drug misuse and alcohol at Skelton wildlife Pond.
