## Skelton Primary School PE and Sport Premium Report for 2016/2017

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the government in April 2013.

It is ring-fenced funding to be used by the school to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport. The focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the national vision.

The national vision is for: "All pupils leaving primary school [to be] physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport."

After evaluating and measuring the impact of our sports premium funding for the academic year 2015- 2016, we are planning to spend this years sport premium, of approximately £10,300 in the following way:
