Parental controls are software and tools which you can install on phones or tablets, games consoles or laptops – and even your home broadband.

You can also use them to help you block or filter the content your child sees when searching online. Also, family-friendly public Wi-Fi can help when you're out and about.

Parental controls are also available to help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for

- manage the content different members of the family can see.

The dangers of water include ,..........

- Very cold temperatures
- Hidden Currents
- Fast flowing water, heware of locks and weirs
- Deep water, it can be difficult to estimate the depth
- There may be hidden rubbish or debris under the surface that can trap, snag or cut
- It can be difficult to get out, banks can be steep, slimy and crumble away
- No lifeguards, most outdoors waterways do not have lifeguards
- Water pollution may make you ill.
