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
Dear Parents.


Year Five Enterprise!

Ways a Parent Can Help with

READING

Help your child

find appropriate

Let your child see you reading!

reading and word games online. Keep a dictionary on hand. Help your child

Read mysteries with your child and try to figure out the clues together.

Have magazines and books in your home.

Movie version

coming out?

look up new words.

Set aside a your child to read -

together first, then talk about which you each liked better. in a quiet place

time and place for

like a comfy chair and a reading light

Visit your public library regularly.

> Look for and read together the books that were your favorites when you were a kid.

Encourage your child to write -

Read the book

letters, thank you notes, emails, journals, lists, stories about their own trips. events, and daily life

Ask your child to draw a comic strip about what happens in the story.

Provide word searches. crossword and other word games and puzzles, or help your child make his/her own

Ask your child questions about what her or she is reading, such as:

- What is the story about?
- Who are the important people in the story?
- Where does the story take place?
- Why do you think that person made that choice?
 What do you think will happen next?
- How did you know about ...?
- Would you recommend this book to your friends?



Share with your child about what you're reading... and encourage your child to do the same

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EDEN CAMP

Yesterday Year 6 travelled back in time to the 1940's. We visited Eden Camp (an outdoor museum housed in the grounds of an original WW2 Prisoner of War Camp) and experienced the sights, sounds and smells of those traumatic years on the home front and the frontline.

The behaviour of the children was impeccable – they displayed mature attitudes towards what they saw and read and hopefully came home full of knowledge. Today they have used their experiences to write an independent piece of writing describing the Blitz...
