I have very proudly given out pens to 12 handwriters this week. Our children's presentation gets better and better.





Free School Meals

To be eligible for free school meals a parent/carers must be in receipt of one of the following:

- Income Support
- Job Seekers Allowance (Income Based)
- State Pension Credit (Guaranteed Credit), or
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs which does not exceed £16,190.

Pupil Premium income is vital for schools and a significant part of our schools' budget. As you are aware all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be eligible for free school meals through the Universal Infant Free School Meals.
