



Sector areas of focus

The current areas of focus for this sector are;

Antisocial Behaviour in Loftus: We have been working with the Local Authority Anti-Social Behaviour Officer and later in July we have two juveniles attending court in an attempt to obtain behaviour injunctions on them as persistent offenders. Additionally another person was issued with an Anti social Behaviour Agreement with arrangements in place to issue one to another person.

Off road motor bikes across the sector.

News

Operation Endurance is ongoing with a specific week of action planned starting 2nd July. This is to target illegal off-road motor bikes causing a nuisance in our neighbourhood.

- We have been tackling speeding in Guisborough and Dunsdale. Some further deployments are planned in Lingdale in conjunction with our Roads Policing Unit and members of the community taking part in Community Speedwatch.
- The recruitment process for Special Constables commenced last month. We are still looking for people who can make an extraordinary contribution in our communities
- Three tenants responsible for anti social behaviour have been evicted from addresses in Carlin How
