Cross Country Champions!

After being postponed twice due to snow, our East Cleveland Cross Country tournament finally went ahead last Friday afternoon and we couldn't be prouder of our children's amazing achievements.

Each and every one of our children gave it their absolute all on a very physically demanding course. As a result of their sheer hard work and determination, out of our 9 cluster schools, we came 2nd overall, only very marginally missing out on 1st place. Our roll of honour also includes 1st for the Year 3&4 boys team, 1st for the Year 5 boys team, 2nd for the Year 6 boys team and 3rd for the Year 5 girls and Year 6 girls.

For the remainder of our children this was their first time competing in this event and they were simply magnificent:. Naia Adams 13th (Y3), Delilah Winspear 15th (Y3) Finlay Turner 13th (Y3) Erin Heathcock 21st (Y5), Kayley Maxwell 23rd (Y5), Liam Anderson 16th (Y5), Harrison Booth 13th (Y6) and Millie Peacock 16th (Y6).

A special award of recognition goes to **Casey Winspear** (Y4) who showed true sportsman and companionship after stopping her own race to help another child from a different school, who was struggling and upset. She stayed with her until help arrived and then carried on to complete the race. We are so incredibly proud of Casey and all of our children. A huge well done!

Out of our 10 children that qualified to round 2, 5 have qualified to round 3! Meaning they finished in the top 8 for Cleveland: **Charlie** 1st, **Poppy** 3rd, **Cohen** 4th, **Erin** 5th and **Kayden** 3rd. A truly amazing achievement!







Sector areas of focus

The current areas of focus for this sector are;

Antisocial Behaviour in Loftus

Calls have increased slightly regarding anti-social behaviour in the Loftus area, particularly around the youth club. We have been working with partner agencies to address the problems and we are continuing to do so. This area remains a hot spot and we have been increasing our patrols and attending the youth club.

News

- We have been working with the staff and young people of Loftus Youth Club and will continue to carry out patrols.
 There has been further damage in the Valley Gardens in Saltburn so we have been increasing our patrols on an evening. There.
- Our PCSOS have delivered briefings to the pupils of Skelton Primary School regarding internet safety and have carried out a number of property marking events.
- A large number of bikes and cars have been seized by our officers and some arrests were made after one vehicle
 was acting suspiciously. Two males were arrested and dealt with for drugs.

This week Stephen Hawking died.

He was an award winning physicist who faced huge challenges in his life. He showed perseverance and resilience to achieve great things.

Early Life

- Stephen Hawking was born on January 8, 1942 in Oxford, England.
- Both his parents studied at Oxford.
- When he was nine, Stephen wasn't doing very well in school and just managed to be an average student.
- He was always interested in how things work, and he took clocks and radios apart, but had trouble putting them back together.
- His childhood nickname was Einstein.
- Stephen was always interested in Maths and Science.
- He won a scholarship to study Physics at Oxford.
- Then, he studied cosmology at Cambridge.

Living with motor neuron disease

- When he was 21, Stephen started falling over, dropping things and his speech became slurred.
- Following tests, doctors concluded that Stephen was suffering from motor neuron disease; a disease which paralysed him, and he required a speech generating device to communicate.
- He worked very hard to earn his PhD and even in his wheelchair he can communicate with a touch pad computer and a voice synthesizer.
- When he was 65, he took a zero-gravity ride, which enabled him to leave his wheelchair, for the first time in 40 years.

Stephen Hawking Quotes

- "It is a waste of time to be angry about my disability. One has to get on with life and I haven't done badly. People won't have time for you if you are always angry or complaining."
- "I don't think the human race will survive the next thousand years, unless we spread into space. There are too many accidents that can befall life on a single planet. But I'm an optimist. We will reach out to the stars."
