Here is an update from Aimee who is trying to find out more about Skelton in the 'olden days'. She has been passed some log books from Skelton Infant School starting in 1862. She thought you'd be interested to hear that in:

- 1881 School was closed by Dr Keith for one month due to a measles epidemic.
- 1893 Mr Wharton visited with toys and picture for the walls.
- 1901 The Education Board 'required that' school stop punishments such as hitting children on the head with books.
- 1916 Low attendance following an air raid.
- 1962 New Skelton Infant School building opened (our lower school).

Ms Walker still has more recent school log books that were maintained until 2002. They tell a very interesting story of daily life here at school! THANKYOU AIMEE


PIZZA
