I had a useful meeting with residents, police, highways and Councillor Foggo about parking around our school site this week. Residents expressed their frustration at drives being blocked and access being dangerously limited should emergency services need to get through. Concern was also expressed at how parked cars often blocked the pavement so that children and residents have to walk on the road to get past. We know that wardens have ticketed families' cars when using the bus bay outside of school and there was the offer of the 'camera car', that simply drives by, photographs offending vehicles and sends tickets 28 days later. Please can we remind you that the safety of your children and our community family is paramount.

**Article 1**

**Article 2**  
Children are treated equally without discrimination.

**Article 3**  
The best interests of the child are the top priority.

**Article 4**  
Governments must do all they can to fulfil the rights of every child.

**Article 5**  
Governments must respect the rights and responsibilities of parents.

**Article 6**  
Every child has the right to life.

**Article 7**  
Every child has the right to a legally registered name.

**Article 8**  
Governments must protect a child's identity.

**Article 9**  
Children should be allowed contact with their parents.

**Article 10**  
Governments should act quickly if a child or their parents want to be together in the same country.

**Article 11**  
Governments must do everything they can to stop children being taken from their own country illegally.

**Article 12**  
Have the right to have a say in all matters affecting them and to have their views taken seriously.

**Article 13**  
Must be free to say what they think and receive all kinds of information.

**Article 14**  
Right to think and believe what they want and to practise their religion.

**Article 15**  
Right to meet other children and to join groups and organisations.

**Article 16**  
Every child has the right to privacy.

**Article 17**  
Every child has the right to reliable information from mass media.

**Article 18**  
Parents share responsibility and the needs of the child come first.

**Article 20**  
If a child cannot be looked after by their family, Governments must make sure they are looked after.

**Article 21**  
If a child is adopted, the first concern must be for what is best for the child.

**Article 22**  
Refugee children have the same rights of any other child.

**Article 23**  
A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life.

**Article 24**  
Governments must do all they can to protect children from harm.

**Article 24**  
Every child has the right to the best possible health.

**Article 25**  
Children placed away from home, will be checked on to make sure they are alright.

**Article 26**  
Governments must provide extra money for children of families in need.

**Article 27**  
Every child has the right to a standard of living that is good.

**Article 28**  
Every child has the right to an education.

**Article 29**  
Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to their full potential.

**Article 30**  
Every child has the right to learn and use the language of their family.

**Article 31**  
Every child has the right to relax, play and join in activities.
