Y5

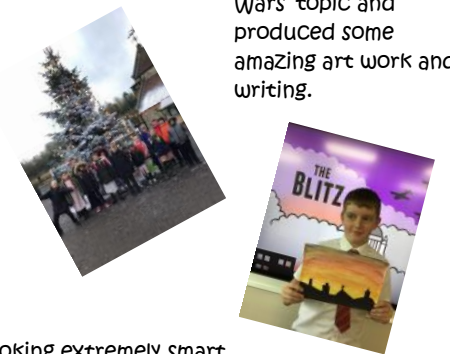
Year 5 have had a very busy term studying the Victorians and were treated to 'A day in the life of a Victorian school'. The children have loved getting their teeth in to the forces topic.
