



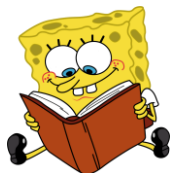
Friday Flyer

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

I am writing to make you aware of the school procedure for children who have unexplained absences from school.

There have been public cases recently where schools have not chased up the reasons as to why children are absent. It has then transpired that there have been tragic circumstances around these absences, e.g. illness of a parent and a child unable to seek help.

We will do everything we can to prevent such situations occurring as I am sure you would agree that your child's safety is paramount to us all.

If your child is not going to be in school please call the office on 01287 650689 or email the school on office@skeltonprimaryschool.co.uk to report their absence. Please do this before 9am on the first day of the absence and every subsequent day.

If we have not heard from you by 10am then we will start to call all the contact numbers that you have provided in order to gain an explanation for the absence. If we still have not been able to ascertain where your child is then **we will make a home visit.** However, if we still haven't been able to get a response then we may report it to the police as your child will then be classed as a 'missing child'.

This procedure is to ensure that we know where your child is and that you are all safe. Please let us know in good time why your child is absent from school. If you would like to speak to someone about this, please make an appointment to see Mr Woolf.
