

Our Rights Respecting team talked in assembly about issues that concern our local environment. <u>Vandalism</u>

Vandalism is a kind of damage that has been done on purpose, often done for no reason. You may have seen it before. Did you know that Vandalism is a Crime and it could get you involved with the police? If you ever saw an object or place being vandalised what would you do? Would you tell a responsible adult or not? Well let me tell you why you should tell a responsible adult/guardian ... because vandalism is against the law, never vandalise anything. It costs a lot of money to repair and your parents/guardian could have the responsibility of paying for it.
