Enrichment Friday is celebrating & extending Life Skills and British values

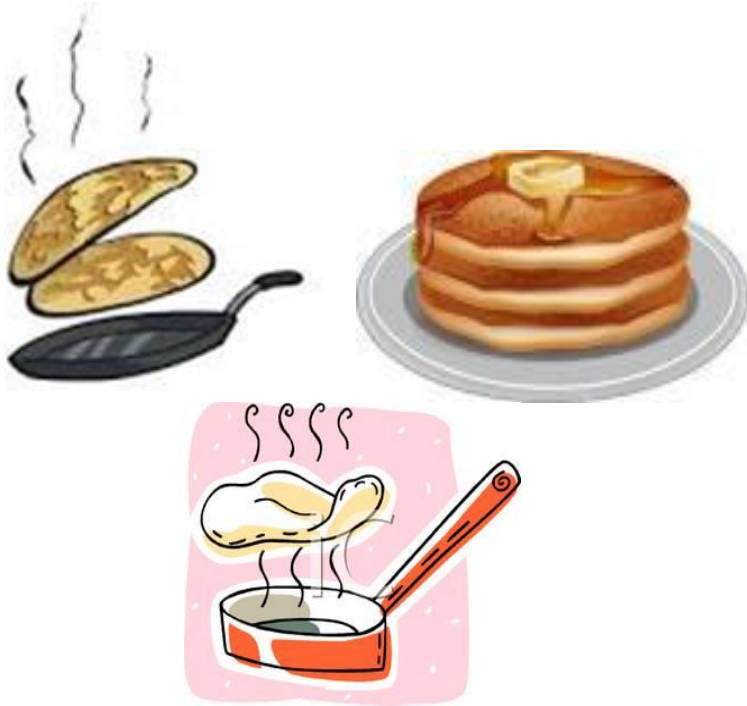
