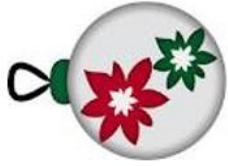

NSPCC GUIDANCE FOR KEEPING YOUR CHILD SAFE ONLINE

- TALK ABOUT IT** From a young age it's good if parents can establish having regular conversations about what their kids are doing on the internet. That doesn't have to be laying down rules, but asking them what they enjoy about the internet.
- STAY POSITIVE** Let children know their parents aren't around just to tell them off, but they are interested in that part of their life. Make it normal to ask them about their day on the internet, just as you'd ask them about their day at school.
- FAMILY AGREEMENT** Some families set up a family agreement that encourages parents and children to sit down together and set down rules. It could be that no one is going to use their devices at the dinner table, and it shows parents can commit to sharing the rules too. You can download a family agreement sheet from the NSPCC website.
- WATCH TOGETHER** The NSPCC website has a page called Share Aware which contains videos that can be watched by parents and children together. They offer tips for staying safe online and encourage discussion between adults and young people. www.nspcc.org.uk/preventing-abuse/keeping-children-safe/share-aware/
- DISCUSS THE NEWS** If, for example, it comes up in the news a celebrity has experienced harassment on the internet, that can be a conversation starter and it normalises having those conversations. Research shows that a lot of young people want to talk to their parents about this.
- HELPING YOU** A lot of parents feel ill-equipped talking about the internet because often their children know more about it than they do. The NSPCC's Net Aware app contains information on hundreds of games, apps and sites. Something else parents can find overwhelming is the vast number of games and apps their children use, which is why we have developed Net Aware. It contains reviews from around 700 parents saying what they like about games, how easy it was to change the settings and other information. For example, a parent who hears their child is using an app like Snapchat can find out about it.
- HELPLINE** As part of a partnership between the NSPCC and mobile network O2, a helpline has been set up to help parents with questions about their child's online behaviour if you need technical advice on how to set up devices with parental controls or just have a question, the trained advisors will help. You can call free on 0808 800 5002 or to into an O2 store to speak to a trained advisor. The NSPCC's 'Light Up Christmas for Children' campaign is aiming to help raise £600,000 for Childline to ensure no child's call goes unanswered – as currently, only three out of four children get through.
