Here are just some of the things we've achieved already thanks to the support of people like you:

- We have saved millions of lives by discovering new ways to prevent, diagnose and treat cancer. In the 1970's less than a quarter of people survived. But over 40 years, survival has doubled; today, one in two people with cancer survive their disease for at least 10 years.
- Our research has helped transform survival for children's cancer—three quarters of children with cancer are now cured, compared with around a quarter in the late 1960's

We hope that everyone at your event had a great time. and that you'll join us again in 2016— we won't stop fighting until the day that cancer is no longer a threat."
