

Skelton Primary School PE and Sport Premium Report for 2015/16

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the government in April 2013 and is available until July 2016.

It is ring-fenced funding to be used by the school to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport. The focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the national vision.

The national vision is for: *“All pupils leaving primary school [to be] physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.”*

In academic year 2015/16, **we will receive sports premium funding of £10,355**. Having consulted with pupils and parents, and to support our wider vision and plans for PE and sport, we plan to spend the Premium in the following ways.

In addition, 15 children from year 1 and year 2 will be given the opportunity to take part in a gymnastics afterschool club therefore increasing their participation in sport.
