Boris Johnson is Prime Minister and the leader of the Conservative Party. In the last election, the Conservatives got 298 Members of Parliament (MPs).


LABOUR

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the game, it is multi-player online gaming platform which allows children to play and create a variety of games in a 3D world. Roblox is free to play and available on all modern smartphones, tablets, desktops, Xbox One, Oculus Rift, and HTC Vive.



What parents need to know about

ROBLOX STUDIO

The Robiox Studio allows users to create their own games and 'worlds' for others to play on the platform. As the games are user generated, it gives users the freedom to potentially include things you do not want your child to be exposed to, for

CHATTING & FRIEND REQUESTS

Whilst the games in Roblox are aimed at 8 to 18-year- olds, there are currently no age to 19-year-olds, there are currently no age restrictions for signing up. This means that both adults and young people can play and communicate with each other and send friend requests through the platform Once a friend request is accepted, this means that they can communicate with

ROBUX ONLINE PAYMENTS

When a user creates a game, they earn omething called 'Robux,' which works as a sometring caused nodus, which works as a currency within the platform and enables the purchase of upgrades and memberships. If the created game is of good quality and attracts multiple players and in-game soverts, children have the ability to earn a lot of 'Robux'. Once a user has earned a certain amount of Robux, they can convert this to sal cash and withdraw it to a PayPal account To withdraw money, users need to be over 13, have a PayPal account and have paid fo the Roblox premium subscription







Ifor Parents

Tell your children to be careful and to think twice before they click any random advert or popup. There a lot of phishing scams that advertise free roblus etc. with the intent of stealing your child's personal information.

UNLIST SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNTS

Make sure your child's social media accounts are not listed in the settings/account information. If they are, advise them to set them to private or remove them from their account. This will ensure that nobody will be able to find and contact them on their social media platforms outside of Roblox.

CHECK SHARED INFORMATION

In the account settings, check that your child is not giving away any personal information in their bio/profile. For example, their full name, phone number or snapchat name. If you see that they have, explain why this is potentially dangerous and remove

2-STEP VERIFICATION

Roblox has a great two-step verification security feature which we recommend you enable to add an extra layer of security to

HAVE A CHAT ABOUT 'GRIEFING'
Griefing is when someone purposely upsets,
another player in a game. This can be done by
setting traps, damaging or stealing something
from another player, instantionally killing them
and generally doing something in the game to
spoil their gameplay. Essentially, Griefing is a
form of cyberbullying and can be extremely
frustrating and upsetting for players.

RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS

RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS
Robiox is a free to play game, but there are still
options to make additional in-game purchases.
If you do not want your child to make payments,
ensure your card is not associated with their
account. If you are happy for your child to make
payments in the game, but want for restrict
specifics, my unernative spins a name or consolar spending, we suggest using a games console gift card. These can be purchased in specific amounts, which will enable you to restrict how much your child spends and removes the need for a credit/debit card to be used with their

DISABLE IN-GAME CHAT
Roblox is great for children to play together and
chat to each other. However, if you want to chait to each other. However, if you want to completely turn off in-game chat for your child (manning they cannot contact anyone, including their friends) you can do so by following these steps: When logged in, go to the Account Settlings page by clicking on the gear icon at the top right corner of the page, then click Settlings. Next, click on the Privacy tab and under 'Who can chat with me in game?' select 'No one' and this will disable in-game chat."

IS TOUR CHILD UNDER 13?

Unfortunately, there are hundreds of YouTube videos showing children how to change their age settings on Robox, so firstly, you should talk to your child to set up some rulea/an agreement. There are additional safety features for children under 13, for example having their posts and chats filtered for inappropriate content and behaviour, so it is worth checking that your child has set up their account with the correct age. You can find this in their account setting.

Threadworms/ Pinworms



Things you should do at home

Medicine kills the threadwarms, but it does not kill the eggs. Eggs can live for up to 2 weeks outside the body.

There are things you can do to stop becoming infected

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- wash hands and scrub under fingernails particularly before eating, after using the toilet or changing nappies
 - encourage children to wash hands regularly
- bathe or shower every morning
- rinse toothbrushes before using them
- keep fingernails short
- towels and soft wash s leepwear, sheets,
- disinfect kitchen and bathroom surfaces toys (at normal temperature)
- vacuum and dust with a damp cloth
- make sure children wear underwear at night change it in the morning

Don't

- do not shake clothing or bedding, to prevent eggs landing on other surfaces
- do not share towels or flannels
- do not bite nails or suck thumbs and fingers

Important

You do not need to stay off school, nursery or work with threadworms.
