## **The Art and Design Learning Pathway**

Onwards to success and triumph...

Drawing - Use a variety of techniques to add interesting effects (e.g. reflections, shadows, direction of sunlight) using charcoal and pencil Tessellation.

Printing -Build up layers of colours - Create an accurate pattern, showing fine detail - Use a range of visual elements to reflect the purpose of the work. Sculpture -Show life-like qualities and real-life proportions or, if more abstract, provoke different interpretations - Use tools to carve and add shapes, texture and pattern Combine visual and tactile qualities. -Use frameworks (such as wire or moulds) to provide stability and form.

Textiles -Show precision in techniques e.g. sewing - Choose from a range of stitching - Combine previously learnt techniques.

Year 6

Printing -Build up layers of colours - Create an accurate pattern, showing fine detail - Use a range of visual elements to reflect the purpose of the work. Drawing - Use a variety of techniques to add interesting effects - Choose a style of drawing - Sketch (lightly) before painting to combine line and colour -

Painting - Use the qualities of watercolour and acrylic paints to create visually interesting pieces - Combine colours, tones and tints to enhance the mood of a piece - Use brush techniques and the qualities of paint to create texture -

## Art Knowledge

In every year the children will study a well know artist. Children will explore who they are, what they are famous for, their influences and how they influenced other artists.

Drawing - Use hatching and cross hatching to show tone and texture -Select & arrange materials for a striking effect -Ensure work is precise.

Painting Mix colours effectively - Use watercolour paint to produce washes for backgrounds then add detail - Experiment with creating mood with colour. Textiles -Shape & stitch materials - Use basic cross stitch & back stitch.

Sculpture -Create and combine shapes to create recognizable forms (e.g. shapes made from nets or solid materials) - Include texture that conveys feelings, expression or movement -Use clay & other moldable materials (modroc) - Add materials to provide interesting detail.

Printing -Use layers of two or more colours - Replicate patterns observed in natural or built environments - Make printing blocks (e.g. from coiled string glued to a block) - Explore ideas in a variety of ways.

Collage -Select and arrange materials for a striking effect - Use a combination of materials that are cut, torn and glued. - Sort and arrange materials - Mix materials to create texture

## Year 4

Drawing - Use different hardness of pencils to show line, tone and texture - Sketch lightly (no need to use a rubber to correct mistakes) - Use shading to show light and shadow. Use coiling, overlapping, tessellation, mosaic and montage -Annotate sketches to explain and elaborate ideas.

Painting - Use a number of brush techniques using thick and thin brushes to produce shapes, textures, patterns and lines - Mix colours effectively - Use water colour paint to produce wash. Year 3

Textiles -Use weaving to create a pattern - Join materials using glue and/or a stitch

Printing -Use repeating or overlapping shapes

- Press, roll, rub and stamp to make prints.

Collage -Use a combination of materials that are cut, torn and glued - Sort and arrange materials - Mix materials to create texture.

Year 2

Drawing - Draw lines of different sizes and thickness - Colour (own work) neatly following the lines - Show pattern and texture by adding dots and lines - Show different shading by using drawing pencils.

Painting - Mix primary colours to make secondary - Add white to colours to make tints and black to colours to make tones.

Sculpture -Use techniques such as rolling, cutting, moulding and carving - Use rolled up paper, straws, paper, card and clay as materials - Use a combination of shapes. Painting - Add white to colours to make tints and black to colours to make tones - Use thick and thin brushes - Mix primary colours to make secondary colours.

Explore what happens when they mix colours. Experiment to create different textures. Understand that different media can be combined to create new effects. Manipulate materials to achieve a planned effect. Select appropriate resources and adapt work where necessary. Use simple tools and techniques competently and appropriately. Create simple representations of events, people and objects.
