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Dear Parents and Carers,

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

School remains open.

I would like to take this opportunity to outline the preventative measures we have put in place in order to minimise the spread of infection, in the event of an outbreak within the school. As per the advice from the government, the school has taken the following actions for infection control:

- *Putting up coronavirus infection control measures information posters around the school*
- *Encouraging good hygiene by promoting the importance of handwashing for at least 20 seconds with water and soap in the following circumstances:*
 - *Before leaving home*
 - *On arrival at school*
 - *After using the toilet*
 - *After breaks and sporting activities*
 - *Before food preparation*
 - *Before eating any food, including snacks*
 - *Before leaving school*

Children may bring a little aqueous or moisturising cream if their hands are sensitive to the constant washing.

- *Using, where practicable and appropriate to do so, alcohol-based hand sanitiser dispensers that contain at least 60 percent alcohol.*
- *Ensuring pupils and staff understand that they must cover their cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue away*
- *Ensuring frequently touched objects and surfaces are cleaned and disinfected more regularly than usual*
- *Calling NHS 111 if someone becomes unwell and isolating any unwell people in a separate room*
- *Advising people who have returned from category 1 specified countries/areas in the last 14 days to self-isolate for 14 days before they return to school*
- *Advising people who have returned from category 2 specified countries/areas in the last 14 days to stay at home if they develop symptoms – the full list of category 1 and category 2 countries can be found on the government website.*



Parents and carers act as role models for our children. I would ask that you encourage good infection control practices, such as thorough handwashing, at home and keep your child informed about the things they can do to discourage the spread of infection.

Unless your child has tested positive for the coronavirus (and hasn't been exposed to anyone with the virus), they should attend school as usual (unless they are too unwell due to an unrelated illness), as per the current government advice.

If you think your child may have been exposed to or has coronavirus, please contact the school at the earliest opportunity.

- *Mothers' Day services on Friday morning at church are cancelled (Children are recording something special for their Mums for a Facebook posting.)*
- *Mothers' Day afternoon tea on Friday is postponed (it will be rearranged for the summer term.)*
- *Face Your Fears, coffee mornings and parent drop-in are temporarily suspended.*

Further action

The school liaises with local Health agencies, so that it is able to use the most up to date advice to inform its decision-making processes. We have reviewed our processes for closure should the time come.

There may be a time when a decision is made to close part, or all, of your child's school. This decision will be made by the Head teacher and Chair of Governors. This closure may be for a short period, for example to facilitate cleaning, or for an extended period. A closure may be advised by the public authorities or be necessary as a result of significant staff absence.

The decision to close will be communicated to families through the normal channels: text, email and Facebook. Parents can help ensure they are well informed, by ensuring they have informed their child's school of their current contact details. We will always seek to give parents and carers as much notification of a decision to close, so they can make appropriate arrangements for the safety and supervision of their child.

Should school close, we will seek to provide families with some useful suggestions on activities that their child can complete at home. This will be sent out promptly after we have communicated any decision to close.


If school is closed, we communicate any updates via our website, Facebook and text.


Our Top Tips for Staying Safe Online
