Off-road Bikes - Skelton East

Police have received numerous complaints of off-road bikes and vehicle related crime throughout the Skelton East ward, particularly around the Parkers Pit area close to Skelton Industrial estate as well as the courts area of Skelton East.

The local neighbourhood team are aware that this causes alarm and distress to local residents and police continue to carry out Operation Endurance with a view to tackling the use of illegal off-road bikes.

Enforcement action has been taken across the East Cleveland area with the support of volunteers and Special Constables. Police would always urge people to call us with any information they may have to help them identify those responsible and encourage residents to report these issues via 101 or call 999 in an emergency.

Midsummer Miners!

Crime, ASB figures and Priorities

Throughout the month of May 2021:

- Police have received a total of 13 reports of antisocial behaviour in the month of May, mainly focussing on vehicle related crime. This is a reduction of 22 reports when compared to this time last year.
- Youth related antisocial behaviour is very low at the present time and officers continue to work closely with Skelton Primary School and monitor local issues
- A total of 32 crimes were reported in May, a decrease of 7 compared to May 2020.
- One male was charged with an alleged common assault.

Summer Safety in Skelton

As lockdown restrictions have lifted so far, certain types of antisocial behaviour have predictably increased.

These include the illegal driving of off-road vehicles on public land, the illegal use of powerful catapults and the antisocial setting of fires in inappropriate locations.

Your neighbourhood policing team has taken action to deal with these matters and will continue to do so.

Officers will monitor hotspots, patrol with high visibility and gather more information about any concerns raised by the community. Contact details are overleaf.

Crime, ASB Figures and Priorities

During April and May, police in the Skelton West ward dealt with the following:

- 8 incidents of antisocial behaviour, down by a third.
- One reported burglary within Boosbeck High Street.
- · Two theft and handling reports.
- · Eight reports of criminal damage.

Ward Priority

Due to a spate of reports of sightings and anecdotal evidence of off-road vehicles being used on public highways and elsewhere illegally, we are focussing on their usage by stepping up patrols in reported locations.

Additionally, we are aware of instances of ball bearings being fired from catapults and causing damage recently. This may have stopped after our recent interventions in neighbouring areas, but the team will not be complacent.
